#### **Argus 23.5.28**

The Hove Stadium for Greyhound Racing was opened on Sat 2 June, 1928 at 7pm. to stage races on Wednesday and Saturday evenings.

### **Argus 28.5.28**

Advertisements for the meeting included "Attractions to come - Motor Cycle Dirt Track Racing, Football, Public Tennis Courts"

# **Argus 29.5.28**

Greyhound track is 525yards. Stadium capacity 18,000 (2005: capacity 2,200), including 3,000 in grandstand. Car park for 750 cars. "Geographically, the track leaves nothing to be desired, its' rural surroundings being both beautiful and a pleasure to the eye."

# **Argus 4.6.28**

Opening night crowd for greyhounds on 2.6.28 was 6-7,000. The local press was pleased to note that "Not a single case of fighting occurred to mar any one of the seven races - the dogs were on their very best behaviour"

#### **Argus 9.628**

First announcement that "the opening Speedway Meeting at the Hove Sports Stadium will take place on Saturday 23rd June, racing starting at 2.30pm"

# Sussex Daily News 19.6.28

A planned practice for riders from the local Motor Cycle clubs, attended by "Mr. J S Hoskins, accompanied by three Australian champions" [Datson, Johnson, and Schlam], was "not possible owing to a temporary hold-up in connection with the supply of shingle". Several hundred riders of both sexes turned up. "The Brighton speedway is a quarter of a mile in circumference. When it is finished, experts say it will be the finest in England." The track is unbanked.

Practice will be Thurs 21.6.28 between 7pm and 10pm.

Riders for the opening meeting on 23.6.28 will include "Lionel Wills, Secretary of the Racing Riders' Association. He will be matched for the second time against "Jarrah" Johnson of Western Australia. On the last occasion, Wills was victorious, and Johnson is anxious to have another race. There will be a demonstration of broadsiding by Charlie Datson, the world's record holder"

### **Argus 20.6.28**

"Great progress has been made with the work of laying the dirt track for motor racing at the Hove Stadium, and practice runs will be possible tomorrow."

"Two Morgan cars, which are classified as side-cars, are to be driven at the opening meeting in competition against side-car outfits. The event is to be a handicap."

"Charlie Datson and Ron Johnson, the two Australian cracks, have taken up residence in Brighton, and express great satisfaction with the track. Charlie Datson says he expects to break his Crystal Palace record time for a mile on the Brighton track, which should be the fastest quarter mile track in England."

# **Argus 22.6.28**

Practice commenced yesterday evening.

# The Motor Cycle 28.6.28

"The speedway was still in an unfinished state. The track itself was very bumpy ... it was far too rough for "Australian" riding. It requires rolling, raking, and watering continually, and the arrangements for rolling and raking last Saturday - consisting of a Ford van towing a length of angle iron - were totally inadequate. Doubtless our English summer will provide all that is necessary in the way of watering."

# **Motor Cycling 4.7.28**

"The track was really opened too soon. In fact, it was not finished until Saturday morning. The track, however, is good and safe"

Argus 23.6.28, Sussex Daily News 25.6.28, Brighton & Hove Herald 30.6.28 [Quote most of Herald article] Crowd estimated at 8,000. 17 events. Promoters: Associated Southern Speedways (Brighton) Ltd.

"The cinder or dirt track, constructed inside the greyhound track, provides for all the onlookers a view of the complete race. It is a quarter of a mile in circumference, and consists of two straight runs with semi-circular turns. Interest is enhanced by the speed with which the straight is covered and the great skill with which the riders negotiate the bends. There was not a dull moment in the whole afternoon."

Just prior to the racing, Lionel Wills, the well-known English champion, came to grief, his Rudge somersaulting and falling upon him. He sustained a badly sprained left ankle and cut hands. Though severely shaken, he insisted on riding in all the events for which he was entered. He was, however, unable to do himself justice in his match with Ron Johnson, 21-years-old Australian, who easily reversed the Crystal Palace decision by arriving home over 3 seconds before Wills.
