To beat Ipswich youngsters on their own track is quite an achievement when you consider how many top class names have come through The Witches Junior ranks over the years.

Since then, the company has continued to acquire pubs, hotels and off-licenses, and, to date, has almost 470 licensed premises of its own, as well as serving many clubs, discos, restaurants and free houses in an area which stretches from Leeds in the North to Northampton in the South, and from the Derby Dales in the West to the East Coast. The company has recently published a pub guide to all its houses, copies of which are on sale in the Stadium bars this evening, and available from the Brewery.

As well as brewing a wide range of traditional draught and bottle beers, the Brewery's Daybrook site also houses the Apollo factory, which produces a variety of mixers, mineral, fruit juices, squashes and other soft drinks, and the Killingley Company which produces Oldie Smiddy Whisky, Langley Gin, Killingley's London Gin, Demerara Rum and Jamaica Rum and supplies many local pubs and clubs from its recently built bonded warehouse.

The Home Brewery has always been keen to be associated with the sponsorship of local sporting events and is pleased to sponsor tonight's important speedway meeting England NL and Scotland NL.
