## Wed. 9.10.35 Portsmouth – Wembley v Wimbledon (Challenge)

PEN 15.10.35

Meeting cancelled due to a waterlogged track.

PEN 7.10.35 reported that the meeting on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> October would be the last of the season at Tipnor. An article in PEN 27.1.36 reported that an application had been lodged for Portsmouth to enter the Provincial

League, with the controller of speedway at the track, Mr T. Bradbury-Pratt, stating that transfers to the team would be arranged for Alec Statham, Bob Lovell and Cyril Anderson. It was announced in the Nottingham Evening Post on 17.3.36 that Nottingham had been drawn against Portsmouth in the National Trophy, with the teams to meet at Nottingham on 28<sup>th</sup> April. However, it was reported in the PEN on 27<sup>th</sup> March that Mr Bradbury-Pratt, Mr J. Parker and Mr J. Ormston had disposed of their interests in the Portsmouth Sports Stadium to Mr Joe Childs, a recently retired highly successful flat racing jockey. Speedway did not then take place at the track in 1936.
