

For the rest it was mainly processional with Hammers more often than not in front. Apart from McKinlay they must be delighted with the form of Norman Hunter, Bob Dugard and Sverre Harrfeldt. Meanwhile Wimbledon will be wondering . . . worrying.

Whoops, who said the dispute was over? This British League clash of the former Nationals (Hammers) and the former Provincials (Wolves) had nearly as many incidents in the pits as out on the track.

All started when West Ham's Aussie Dave Wills pranged the safety fence in avoiding fallen Bob Andrews in the first heat. Dave got a trip to Popular Hospital and a chipped shoulder for his gallentry and West Ham got trouble.

The second heat had Bobby Dugard doing four laps with the tapes wrapped around him. He protested in vain to referee Humphrey that the race should have been re-run because of an unsatisfactory start. By Heat 4 tempers were even more frayed and voices were even louder. Hammers put Simmons out to take the place of Wills. They clain=med that as Wills was supplementary reserve they were entitled to field the man with the next lowest average. Supplementary reserves cannot be replaced said the referee when Wolverhampton protested. So Hammers had just Ted Ede in Heat 4 and when he retired with motor trouble, Wolves cruised round to a 5-0 heat win and into the lead. After that the meeting went on smothly though I don't know why West Ham didn't give Ede another ride in Heat 11 - he could have had five. McKinlay, Hunter and Harrfeldt were all unbeaten by the opposition and Dugard looked good in two races. Wolves' second strings Airey, Guasco and Francis looked capable of teaching the heat leaders a thing or two.

But Norman Hunter rode brilliantly to split the Wimbledon pair - Nygren and Reg Luckhurst - to secure the pot for the lads at Custom House. Johnny Edwards also came into the Wimbledon team to replace Mike Coomber. He gained a paid max from his first two rides but did not add to his total when used twice to replace the pointless Geoff Hughes.

McKinlay was given a hard race for the Silver Sash by Boocock, his experience paying off in the end.

all sewn up by the end of Heat 12 when Norman Hunter won a great scrap with Cyril Maidment. Encouraging show form Norman Nevitt who picked up 8 points. Nevitt had a lucky escape when his machine bucked down the back straight in Heat 11 an d he was thrown off the back, without injury.

The night the Hammers visited Sheffield will long be remembered among speedway fans as a night of speedway splendor.

After level-pegging through much of the contest, the Hammers saw victory come within their reach after a fantastic eleventh heat that almost brought the crowd to their feet in excitement.

It began with Sheffield's John Dews making a bad start and trailing apparently hopelessly behind the field. But the events of the next 45 seconds were to surprise Dews just as much as the crowd.

Sheffield's Billy Bales overtook West Ham's Norman Humter after a titanic second lap tussle ... but seconds after taking the lead, Bales' machine failed and he was forced to drop out.

Then came Dews' mighty effort. In a burst of speed that brought his front wheel from the track, he overtook Hammer rider Sverre Harrfeldt, and surged on to pass Hunter and take the lead only 50 yards from home.

But there was yet another twist in store for the crowd in this race in a million. For Harrfeldt's engine failed half way round the final lap, and he pushed his machine over the line to loud handclapping from a delighted crowd ... And earned his team a vital point.

But in the final heat, West Ham made certain that victory was not to slip through their fingers. Ken McKinlay put up a good show and finished 50 yards in front of the field, with teammate Malcolm Simmons in third place.

It was a superb finish to a contest which, in the early stages, looked as though it could be far from spectacular.

On several occasions, one got the impression that the West Ham machines could out-pace the Sheffield bikes on the straights. Only recently, Sheffield's Clive Featherby complained that his amchine wasn't fast enough, and after the Hammers' visit, he can be sure of it. In two heats, the first and seventh, he was forced into second place, not because his riding ability was lower than that of his opponents, but because his machine had not got the vital thrust for coming out of the bends.

Never have so many (West Ham and their ebullient supporters) owed so much to one man (Malcolm Simmons). The drama, the tension, the excitement of this meeting is still running through my veins.

But let's begin at the beginning. The eternally memorable match between Wimbledon and West Ham was a K.O. Cup replay. Before the racing commenced it was announced that the home side were without Trevor Hedge; West Ham minus Norman Hunter (married Saturday afternoon) and Severre Harrfeldt (eye injury). Several Hammers fans left without seeing a heat when Harrfeldt's name was withdrawn from their team.

They will live to regret it. For the remaining riders rose to the occasion and produced a gripping cup-tie that was not decided until the last heat.

And the man who won it for West Ham was Mal Simmons. A breathless West Ham official, asked what he throught of Simmons'

performance (he dropped just one point in five rides) replied: "What can I say?" I feel the same way, too. There is simply no superlative that can do justice to Simmons. This 19-year old rode like a world champion.

To my mind, the final testimony to his amazing progress this year came in Heat 13. Wimbledon were six points down and included Olle

Nygren to partner Reg Luckhurst. But will all the dash, courage and know-how of a far more seasoned campaigner, Simmons was away into the Wimbledon night to record another fast win. Three times he broke the 67-second barrier - which is something nobody else has done this year.

Praise for Wimbledon also, for they played their part in this wonderfully thrilling meeting, even though they lost John Edwards with a sprained ankle. Men like Nygren, who stood in the middle cherring his men on.

Barry Briggs is British Champion again. Nigel Boocock, Ken McKinlay, Brian Brett, Reg Luckhurst and Jimmy Gooch will join him in the World Final. Mike Braodbanks will be reserve. They are the stark facts on British speedway's glamour occasion. The stark facts on Speedway's NIGHT OF SHAME. I have delayed writing this report for a couple of days for fear I might write something I would regret. Yet here I am on Thursday still as sick to the back teeth with the whole business as I was on that best forgotten Tuesday night. Maybe the 18 riders who lined-up for the British Final may have doen something they now regret. Or they may be pleased with themselves that their eleventh hour unofficial strike paid dividends. Unfortunately the wrong people are getting the blame for this apology for a great occasion. West Ham Stadium have been attaked in letters that have landed on my desk. Yet but for the West Ham directors tha 20,000 crowd probalby would not have seen a single race. They kept the peace by offering to pay the riders the extra points money thay had suddenly demanded. It most certainly was not up to them. But they thought of the people who had travelled, not only a couple of miles down the road, but the length and breath of the country. The promoters, criticised often enough by supporters and press, cannot be exonerated. I am told that the riders payments for this meeting was agreed with Speedway Riders' Association chairman Jack Biggs as long ago as the end of July! What more can they do? Had they backed down and let the riders have their money they would have been left wide open to future demands. I know the riders take immense risks to please the speedway public. I also know that I wouldn't swop jobs with them, not for £100 a point (but then I'm a coward). The question of whether riders are underpaid or not is not the issue at stake. There are ways and means of negotiationg for better money and this strike action, which is alleged to have gone against a decision by the senior S.R.A officer, is not one of them. The effects of their action could be far reaching. B.B.C. Sportsview was very fair. In their excellent clip on Wednesday evening they avoided mentioning the strike but the damage had already been done. The morning papers had gone to town because for them this was a good news story. The sad details will not have encouraged any would-be speedway followers to pursue their interest. And the casuals who visited West Ham on Tuesday night are unlikely to return. If I have gone "on" a bit then I apologise but these were facts and comment that I felt just had to be published. Because of the strike, the 45 minute late start, the 11.15 finish, the often diabolical wait between races and some rather odd refereeing decisions, the fact that some of the racing was very, very good has been overlooked. It's all part of the tragedy of this night when speedway's shop window caved in. But for the string of disaters and mini-disasters I have listed the fans would have gone home happy. Nothing was ever certain. In fact only champion Briggs was certain World Final qualifier before his last ride. It kept the tension going right up until quarter past eleven when Broadbanks edged Gordon Guasco out of the Wembley reserve spot. Some riders had bad luck. Men like Nigel Boocock who would have lifted the British title but for a tenth heat motor failure when he was yards in front, or even Briggs who may have got a maximum had his plug lead not worked loose on the first bend of his first ride. The champ lost 75 yards because of that but by some throttle bashing that only Briggs would have dared he closed the gap and eventually took Colin Gooddy on the last bend to get a third place point. The strain was too much for Briggs' leathers. They split in protest and Barry had to ride his remaining four races, and receive throphy, £100 cheque and laurel wreath from Olympic gold medallist Mary Rand, wearing his mechancis underpants over his leathers, which I am sure is a splendid advert for the merits of Y-fronts! Ivan Mauger had his bad luck before the meeting began. Injuries to leg, foot, and finger were too much of a hadicap. So we are still unable to gauge Mauger's true potential. Yet in my humble opinion the unluckiest of them all was Charlie Monk. So Charlie was lucky when Briggs had the plug lead trouble when they clashed. So he was lucky when he and Bill Andrews tangled in heat five after he missed the gate. Charlie was second in the re-run after missing the gate again. The quiet man saw his World Final hopes crumble around him in vital 20th heat exclusion. Jimmy Gooch, Ken McKinlay and Monk were all sweating on a World Final spot in that last race. One was going to be unlucky. McKinlay and Monk diced at the front for two laps and then on the pits bend McKinlay winding it on around the outside, slid into the fence. Monk was excluded for boring, a decision, which at the time, I thought was because referee Gordon Little had seen something I had not. But on Sportsview a night later I saw all and unless by some quirk of camera angles the picture we got was all wrong I certainly didn't think Monk had anything to do with McKinlay's fall. On such decisions rested our six men for Wembley. McKinlay you might say was lucky. The same could be said for Gooch who won the re-run and who, in fact had earlier in the evening been excluded form a re-run and then allowed back in the race after he had explained what happened to the referee. Brian Brett amply made up for the hash he made of the 1964 British Final by riding sensibly and steadily to reach his first ever World Final while Reg Luckhurst, after a pointless second ride, burst through with eight points from his last three rides to reach the Final. Gooch is another Final first-timer, success had indeed come late in life to Jim, and it is interesting to note that exactly half the Wembley line-up home and abroad will be World Final debs. This, more than anything else, illustrates the all-round strength of the Hammers who did not allow the fact that the Cheetahs were League leaders to worry them.

Oxford's performance was disappointing by any token. For a team hoping to finish at the top of the table it was appalling.

Unless Ron How makes a quick return, the Cheetahs will soon be toppled from their perch.

Something really must be done about the Knock Out Cup Final. The general principle of the thing is all right but the final, the ultimate goal of the 18 original starters, must be improved if the competition is going to be given a fair chance.

Statistically West Ham ploughed their way to a handsome 30-point victory in the first leg of the final against Exeter and by the time you read this it should have proved enough to give them the Cup. But where was the ceremony, the atomsphere and the sense of occasion, which should surround a Cup Final? I can tell you it certainly wasn't at West Ham last Tuesday night.

Even the programme declared on its front cover that this was the second leg! A typographical error no doubt but what was there different about the whole Custon House presentation to set this meeting apart from the 26 that have preceded it? Precisely nothing.

Cup Final? It could have been a league match, challenge match of a novices knockabout for all the difference. When the promoters come to discuss plans for 1966 I hope they will bear in mind some way of making the K.Ocup Final something better to aim for than this.

I'm not getting at the riders. They performed admirably and despite the large points gap between the two sides some of the racing was interesting and exciting. West Ham won comfortably, and it could have been even more comfortable but for engine failures to Norman Hunter and Malc Simmons at inopportune moments.

Sverre Harrfeldt, who after winning two races, went to the ambulance room to have a cracked rib strapped, scored his regular Custom House maximum and at the same time was involved in the best race of the night - Heat 12 - when he had a rare old tussle with generally out of luck Colin Gooddy.

Reg Trott bore out my remarks of last week when he collected 12 paid 13 and missed the chance of a paid maximum by having to ride, unhappily at that, the track spare in one heat. Hunter would have got a maximum but for his engine failure, McKinlay was paid for 15, though unselfishly getting 11 points, and Simmons would have been paid for 14 but for his engine failure.

What Exeter doing meanwhile? Relying to a great extent on Jack Gerna who was the only established Falcon to approach his best form. Chirs Blewett was taken to hospital after crashing three times in two races! Chris crushed a finger and before Exeter fans start giving that as a reason for their big defeat let it be said that Ivor Hughes, the man who replaced him, gave tope scorer Geran the best support.

West Ham cleared the first hurdle of their British League, London and Knock-out Cups treble here this evening with a good 6-point win over the Falcons to give them the K.O.Cup by an aggregate 114 points to 78. But in winning this second leg match by 51-45 the Hammers had a couple of shocks on the way ... Shocks which could have put paid to their chances of the British League and London Cup Titles. In the second heat Chris Blewett's footrest got caught in Sverre Harrfeldt's front wheel and ripped out most of the spokes. The fact that a more serious accident didn't occur was a wonder. But a more serious pile-up did occur later - in Heat 12 - and unfortunatley it was Blewett who was again involved in the smash. Coming out of the first bend he and Hammers' skipper Ken Mckinlay locked together and both shot into the fence at full speed.

The crash knocked both riders out like a whistle and for a time the worse was feared for both riders, but they soon regained faculties -McKinlay even coming out and winning the re-run. For Blewett the crash meant a trip to hospistal where a broken collar-bone was diagnosed. Faced with their second home defeat in two weeks, the Falcons made a fighting effort of the closing races; took Heats 13 and 14 by the maximum 5-1 to come within 2-points of their visitiors, but West Ham's 4-2s in the final two heats gave them their second leg victory to add to the 30-point lead they had from the previous Tuesday. One shouldn' make too many excuses for the Falcons; West Ham were a truly great team and fully deserved the Trophy, but surely Exeter

deserved the consolation of winning this leg. But once again it was mechanical troubles which upset them.

Colin Gooddy was forced to retire in the opening heat when the race result would have surely been a 4-2 for Exter instead of West Ham and twice Jack Geran was forced to retire when well placed because of similar problems to his machine and others that he borrowed throughout the evening in an effort to halt the Hammers.

Not only did the Hammers take the match, but points-wise they also took the glory with Harrfeldt and McKinlay topping the evening's score chart with 14 and 13 points respectively, McKinlay being paid for 14 when he finished behind Harrfeldt in Heat 4 when the pair of them suffered their only defeat of the match at the hands of Gooddy, who just managed double figures to head the Falcons' score card with 10 paid 11.
